A REPORT FROM THE 2023 MINISTERIUM NOMINATING COMMITTEE

I bring you greetings on behalf of the Ministerium Nominating Committee. My name is Rev. Mary Chung March and I serve as the Chair of this committee. According to Ministerium bylaws in Article 1, Section 1.1, "The chairpersons of the regional ministerial associations, and the presidents from each of the ethnic associations of the Evangelical Covenant Church (as defined by Article XV of the bylaws of the Evangelical Covenant Church) and the presidents of ministerium associations, approved by the ministerium, shall constitute the Nominating Committee of the Covenant Ministerium."

The Ministerium Nominating Committee has appreciated the prayers and many names people have put forward. After many meetings, times of prayer, and much discernment on the part of many candidates, the Ministerium Nominating Committee is happy to present two candidates for the Ministerium Secretary position and two candidates for the Ministerium President position.

The nominating committee met six times between November 2022 and May 2023 to engage in the nominating committee discernment process intentionally striving for a balance of men and women as well as a balance of ethnic and regional representation.

MINISTERIUM NOMINATING COMMITTEE WORKING RULES

- We will strive for an even number of men and women officers.
- We will not have more than two officers from the same conference.
- We will have at least one ministerium officer who is a member in good standing of an ethnic association and be mindful of diverse ethnic representation.
- We will give special consideration to nominees from conferences that have not had an officer in the last cycle.

We are grateful for this final candidate list and we believe these candidates are the right candidates for this time in our denomination. What this final candidate list does not show is our intentionality in considering and asking women as nominees for the President position and men for the Secretary position. It also does not show our intentionality in considering and asking leaders of color to consider both positions. Our Nominating Committee did a thorough job approaching and discerning a diverse group of leaders across all eleven conferences prayerfully seeking the right person for the right job at the right time. Candidates from all eleven conferences were recommended and considered. We also received feedback from the Ministerium officers who currently serve or served in these two positions and asked for insight on what specific characteristics, traits, and gifting would be best for these positions. All these factors

were considered in determining the nominees. In each case, two people rose to the top and accepted the invitation.

MINISTERIUM PRESIDENT POSITION

In total, we had 60 separate recommendations for the Ministerium President position. All 60 were considered and the pool was narrowed to a smaller group to be invited to consider the nomination.

Job Description: The Ministerium President shall be an ordained minister in good standing of the ECC. The President leads the Ministerium Officers in their meetings and business throughout the year. The President prepares the agendas and convenes the meeting of the Ministerium Exec Committee each November and the ECC Ministerium Annual Meeting each June. The President is also a voting member of the Board of Ordered Ministry and serves on the Executive Committee of the Board of Ordered Ministry serving as the Ministerium's representative on this Board. The President grants/denies access to the email roster of credentialed clergy in the ECC for communication throughout the year. The President grants/denies the exemption from payment of Ministerium dues because of hardship. The President represents the Ministerium in requested duties at the Midwinter Conference and the ECC Annual Meeting. The President represents the Ministerium in other areas throughout the ECC as requested. The President is among those who lay hands on the ordinands at the ECC Ordination Service.

The two candidates for Ministerium President are: Rev. Harvey Drake Rev. Tom Ek

MINISTERIUM SECRETARY POSITION

In total, we had 30 separate recommendations for the Ministerium Secretary position. All 30 were considered and the pool was narrowed to a smaller group to be invited to consider the nomination.

Job Description: The Ministerium Secretary shall be a minister in good standing of the ECC. The Secretary shall take minutes at each business meeting, including the Ministerium Executive Committee held each November, and the Annual Meeting of the Ministerium held each June; the Secretary shall submit minutes from the Annual Meeting in a timely manner to the Ministerium Exec Board and the Office of Ordered Ministry. Under the direction of the Ministerium President, the Secretary shall send out correspondence throughout the year as it pertains to the Executive Committee of the Ministerium or the entire Ministerium. She/He will be responsible for coordinating housing information for each Executive Committee meeting in collaboration with the Events Office of the ECC. He/She will be responsible for requesting and receiving and sharing annual reports from each regional conference and Ministerium Association. In partnership with the Office of Ordered Ministry and the Vice-Secretary, the Secretary will also track updates needed to the Ministerium and CovChurch websites regarding current reports, minutes, and resources. The Secretary shall also maintain/access an accurate list of the current members of the Executive Committee of the Ministerium in partnership with the Ordered Ministry Office.
